
Surprised by Hope: A New Sermon Series

I'm excited to announce our upcoming sermon series based on N.T. Wright's book, Surprised by Hope: Rethinking Heaven, the Resurrection, and the Mission of the Church. Wright challenges many common assumptions about the Christian hope, inviting us to rediscover what the Bible actually teaches about life after death, resurrection, and God's ultimate plan for creation. Rather than focusing on "going to heaven when we die," Wright reminds us that God's promise is about heaven coming to earth—a renewed creation where God dwells with humanity forever. This series will help us reimagine our faith and reshape how we live as God's people today.

Heaven and Earth Together: God's Original Design

When we read "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1), we might assume God created two separate realms—one above for the divine, one below for humanity. Yet as the

creation narrative unfolds in verse 2 and beyond, we discover something more profound: God's focus is on earth and its story with humanity. From the very beginning, heaven and earth were meant to overlap, with God's presence dwelling among his people. The Garden of Eden itself was a place where heaven and earth met, where God walked with Adam and Eve in the cool of the day. This was God's original intention not separation, but communion.

Surprised by Hope: A New Sermon Series (continued)

When Heaven Touches Earth: Glimpses in the Old Testament

Throughout Genesis and the Old Testament, we see remarkable moments when heaven breaks through to earth. Consider Jacob at Bethel, fleeing from his brother, sleeping with a stone for a pillow. In his dream, he saw a ladder connecting heaven and earth, with angels ascending and descending. Upon waking, he exclaimed, "Surely the LORD is in this place... This is none other than the house of God; this is the gate of heaven" (Genesis 28:16-17). Later, at Mahanaim, Jacob encountered angels of God, recognizing that God's heavenly host accompanied him on his earthly journey. These weren't escapes from earth to heaven, but divine invasions—moments when the veil grew thin and God's realm intersected with ours.

Heaven and Earth United: The Word Became Flesh

The ultimate meeting of heaven and earth came in Jesus Christ. In the Incarnation, God didn't call us up to heaven; he came down to earth. "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us" (John 1:14)—literally, he "tabernacled" with us, echoing God's presence in the wilderness. In Jesus, we see heaven's reality breaking into earth's brokenness: the blind see, the lame walk, sins are forgiven, and death itself is defeated. His resurrection wasn't an escape from the physical world, but its transformation—a preview of God's plan to renew all creation. Jesus didn't come to show us the way out of this world, but to demonstrate God's intention to redeem it.

Heaven on Earth Today: The Church as God's Temple

This story continues today in the most surprising way—through us. As God's people, we are now the place where heaven and earth meet. Paul writes that we are "God's temple" where the Spirit dwells (1 Corinthians 3:16). When we gather for worship, serve our neighbors, pursue justice, and embody Christ's love, we become thin places where God's heavenly reality breaks into our earthly existence. Our mission isn't to abandon earth for heaven, but to pray and work for God's kingdom to come "on earth as it is in heaven." Every act of compassion, every work of justice, every gesture of love is a foretaste of the world to come—when heaven and earth will finally and fully unite.

Join us for this journey through Surprised by Hope as we rediscover the biblical vision of our future and how it transforms our present. When we understand that God's plan is to bring heaven to earth, everything changes—our worship, our work, and our life in the world.

Please join us for this wonderful series.







Adult Sunday School



No surprise is a good surprise. At least according to thirty-four-year-old Daisy Richardson. So when it's revealed in dramatic fashion that her esteemed father had been involved in a public scandal before his untimely death, Daisy's life becomes complicated—and fast.

For one, the Richardsons must now sell the family home in Georgetown they can no longer afford, and Daisy's mother is holding on with an iron grip. Her younger sister, Wallis, is ready to move on to bigger and better things but falls fast and hard for the most inconvenient person possible. And then there's Atlas, Daisy's best friend. She's always wished they could be more, but now he's writing an exposé on the one subject she's been desperate to avoid: her father.

Daisy's plan is to maintain a low profile as she works to keep her family intact amid social exile, public shaming, and quickly dwindling savings. But the spotlight always seems to find the Richardsons, and when another twist in the scandal comes to light, Daisy must confront the consequences of her continued silence and summon the courage to stand up and accept the power of her own voice.

October 1st marks the first day of the Voucher Program's new season! For those who may not know, The Closet has several giveback initiatives, including the Voucher Program, Truck Ministry, Grants, Scholarships, and the Bread Pantry.



The Voucher Program operates 10:00 AM – 2:00 PM every

day the store is open. It is designed to support community members experiencing hardship, those who are unhoused, living in shelters, recently unemployed, or simply in need. Individuals can visit one of the partner congregations, social services, or affiliate organizations. A case manager or congregation representative will assess their situation and write a referral for them to come to The Closet and receive essential items, at no cost to them.

Here's the part many people don't realize: The Closet covers 100% of this program. No outside organization, county program, or government agency funds it; only YOU, the customers. Every purchase you make helps ensure neighbors in need have access to necessities. This is why The Closet is so deeply grateful to the customers and donors. Your support has a real and lasting impact every single day.
